Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND)

Langley School is a 100 place generic primary special school for pupils aged 3 - 11 years with a range of needs. We aim to develop attitudes and skills that will enable each individual to become as independent as possible and participate confidently as community members. To do this, we provide a broad, balanced and personalised curriculum, which includes the National Curriculum.

We cater for pupils with specific learning needs, including Autism Spectrum Disorder and moderate learning difficulties. Each pupil's needs are met by ensuring the curriculum and the teaching and learning environment are specific to them.
